President's Annual Report for Calendar Year 2022


We did it! We completed the renovations on our Giving Hope House, and it is **BEAUTIFUL!** There were many disappointments and delays, but the house has been transformed into a welcoming home. We are extremely grateful for Mr. John Kessler, who first mentioned acquiring the vacant house that is adjacent to our parking lot. John not only mentioned acquiring the house, he dedicated countless hours to working on the renovations. We can't thank him enough for all he did to bring excellence to this big project! We then must thank the One Eighty Enterprises for sending their team to finish the vast amount of work needed in painting all rooms inside and the two-story exterior of the home; installing all new cabinets in the kitchen; laying all new flooring inside; rebuilding the front and back porches; and all the other tasks involved in the transformation. And then there was the non-profit "Humble Dwellings" led by founder Karen VanDeCasteele, that put the finishing touches on the house. They made our Giving Hope House into a warm, "move-on-in" home that all who enter, want to stay. It truly took much effort, including the donations of so many who helped us raise over \$82,000 to pay for the renovations. Our **GREAT BIG THANK YOU** to each of you. You invested into the lives of those who will have a place to call home, while they strive to also experience TRANSFORMATION of their personal lives!

Our first annual audit was conducted by Mr. Chris Vershaw, CPA. We are very proud to share that Heart of Hope Ministries received his highest audit opinion!!! Due to increased grant revenue and investments made in renovating our Giving Hope

House, we finished the year with Total Assets of over \$410,000! And our 2023 Budget targets additional growth as we strive forward in getting our Business Property at 900 18th Avenue in Rock Island adding value to the community, and generating revenue for program expansion.

Our vision statement expresses our goal of revitalizing Rock Island neighborhoods, providing opportunities that empower individuals to become self-sufficient, and equipping future generations for success.

#### A Recap of Special Events In 2022:

- In April, over 100 computers were distributed to households meeting poverty income guidelines by an organization called PCs for People. They came with a semi-truck from Oak Lawn, IL and people lined up!
- In June, we were honored with an award from the Rock Island County NAACP Committee for their 2022 Religious Image Award.
- In August, Heart of Hope Ministries participated in the Martin Luther King Jr. Family Fund Day Parade!
- In August, we invited our supporters to join us for an Open House as we showcased our Giving Hope House. Four local pastors, and numerous community leaders joined us also. Miles Brainard, Director of Economic Development, was one of our guests. He saw the house pre-renovations and helped with the acquisition. After attending the open house, he commented that he was thinking of some other houses in Rock Island that he could get us to flip!
- In September, Cassin Wolfe and Lucas Dengler of Modern Woodmen of America hosted a very successful Golf Outing Charity Fundraiser for Heart of Hope. These two amazing young men were able to generate \$6,482!
- In November, we held our first Annual Dinner Gala at the Rock Island Holiday Inn. We were extremely blessed by a wonderful evening as our guests filled the room and enjoyed the program. We were able to raise around \$16,000!
- In December, we hosted a Christmas Community Give-away that caused families to line up outside to receive new clothing, underwear, coats, boots, gloves, hats, scarves, toilet paper, pillows, blankets, and toys! This was made possible by the generosity of SO MANY!
- In December, we created special Christmas Baskets for the elderly and disabled and blessed them with new blankets, and needed household items, and of course candy. A Christmas Card containing a \$20 gift card was also included thanks to Woodriver Baptist.

#### **Heart of Hope Ministries continues to partner with these agencies:**

- **Christian Care Men's Rescue Mission** serving at their outreach center once a month and sharing of food and clothing donations between organizations.
- **Royal Neighbors of America Heart of Hope** Ministries has a chapter relationship with this very supportive organization. They provide \$700 quarterly in support and \$1,000 matching grant award for fundraisers!
- Churches United our Food Pantry is listed as an agency under their umbrella. Food resources are made available to us as they receive them.
- **River Bend Food Bank -** where we purchase food for our weekly distributions. We also receive a monthly delivery through the State of Illinois EFP Program.

- Midwest Food Bank from Peoria, IL is a wonderful source of free food distributed monthly in our area at the QC Expo Center.
- We owe much gratitude to Little Caesars Pizza in Rock Island, and Hy-Vee Food Stores on Locust **Street in Davenport** for their years of donated pizzas and bread and pastries weekly. Two area farmers also provide fresh eggs and produce in season.
- **Underwear Because We Care** organization continues to provide new underwear garments for men, women, and children twice a year.
- Modern Woodmen of America, The Rock Island Public Library, The Rock Island Rotary Club, Walmart Stores, Silvis, and Aetna Insurance have all been wonderful partners in 2022.

## Reporting on our 2022 Efforts


**FOOD PANTRY:** In 2022 our Food Pantry served 3,510 visitors to our pantry and, made 1,943 deliveries to the elderly and disabled. This totals 5,453! These visitors reported 13,319 family members in their households. **This represents a 40% increase in individual family members being served between 2021 and 2022! Over 202,000 pounds of food was given to these needy families.** Since opening our Food Pantry in May of 2014, we have served 19,793 visitors representing 72,002 family members! What amazing numbers reflecting the difference we are able to make in the lives of those in need in our community! Another

amazing fact is that we are able to distributed healthy meats, produce, dairy items, canned and boxed food items, and toiletries for only \$.66 per individual served!!!

**CLOTHING MINISTRY:** Pre-Covid 19, our clothing ministry had an average of 25 visitors per month, estimating about 300 visitors per year. We learned to be innovative and put our clothing and small household items outside on Thursdays to allow food pantry visitors to make clothing selections when they came for food. Now, hundreds of clothing items are taken by our outside visitors from an abundant supply brought in from numerous donors. Neighborhood youth were able to select school clothing items which included shoes, socks, underwear, coats, gloves, and hats.

**YOUTH OUTREACH MINISTRY:** We plan to start our youth after school programs again this summer after discontinuing due to the pandemic. We have been able to give food and clothing items directly to many of our neighborhood young people who live in the neighborhood of our Outreach Center. Many of these young people are from large African families that were refugees to our communities and have very limited financial resources. Illinois Casualty Company held a back-to-school backpack and school supplies giveaway for us in July. Many families were served through this. Left over items were brought to our outreach center for further distribution.

ADULT OUTREACH PROGRAMS: We network with numerous other community organizations to assist adults in need of those items that we cannot supply. We can provide food, clothing, and referrals. Our computer lab is available for usage by individuals to look for job opportunities, type up resumes, and search for information. We have seen some of our frequent volunteers obtain employment due to these resources. Several of our volunteers obtained employment with John Deere during 2022! Food and Clothing has been given to help clients prepare for employment positions. Assistance has been given for travel needs, medication costs, or other miscellaneous emergency needs.
